

**KEY TRUTH**

**Our attitude and m\_\_\_\_\_ as we go through trials and suffering in our life gives evidence of true salvation or not.**

- In chapter 1, James addressed the p\_\_\_\_\_ of trials in the Christian’s life...In chapter 5, he returns to the subject again to address the attitude and mindset Christians should adopt while going through a trial or hardship in this life.

**“Could You Hurry A Little?”**

“O Dear God, ‘When will there be only goodness?’  
After centuries of war, greed, and lust  
After indulgences shamelessly practiced  
After hatred, hostility, jealousy, and abuse  
Murder and martyrdom, crime and cruelty, curses and rebellion  
After whimpering cries from starving children  
After tragedy and catastrophe  
Loneliness and despair  
At last..... at long last  
‘There will be only goodness.’

Your promise is your guarantee  
But please hurry it up a little!”

**We live in a sinful, fallen world; therefore....**

**1. Christians will face t\_\_\_\_\_ in this life.**

Job 5: 7 “Yet man is born to trouble as surely as sparks fly upward.”

John 16:33 “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace; in this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”

Acts 14:22 “We must go through many hardships to enter the kingdom of God.”

**Christians must also face p\_\_\_\_\_ for the cause of Jesus Christ.**

2 Tim 3:12 “In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.”

**2. Christians will go through painful c\_\_\_\_\_.**

- The question is not IF trouble will come....but how must we, as Christians, respond when we are in the middle of it. James warns us about losing our patience due to our circumstances.

“Patience”: James uses two different Greek words for patience in these verses

#1- *Patient*”: In James 5: 7-8, 10; patience in reference to people

#2- "Persevered": verse 11; to remain under; speaks of endurance under great stress; patience in reference to conditions, situations, and circumstances

Patience: "to stay put and stand fast when you'd like to run away"

### HOW DO CHRISTIANS PATIENTLY ENDURE TRIALS IN THIS LIFE?

**1. We endure trials patiently by anticipating the Lord's r\_\_\_\_\_ . (vv.7-9)**

- "Coming"(Parousia): appears more than 500 times in the Bible; means more than just coming but also "presence/arrival"
- Mentioned three times in verses 7,8,9

**2. We endure trials patiently by remembering the Lord' j\_\_\_\_\_ . (v.9)**

- Bema S\_\_\_\_\_ : 2 Cor. 5:10; Rom. 14:10; 1 Cor. 3: 13-15

**3. We endure trials patiently by following Biblical e\_\_\_\_\_ of patience. (v.10)**

**4. We endure trials patiently by recognizing the Lord's broad p\_\_\_\_\_ for our life. (v.11b)**

Purpose of Job's Trials:

- a. T\_\_\_\_\_ Job's Faith: James 1: 2-4
- b. Prove Job's Faith is genuine.
- c. Thwart Satan's attempt to destroy f\_\_\_\_\_
- d. S\_\_\_\_\_ Job's faith and enable him to see God more clearly

"I hope in some way I can take my wheelchair to heaven. With my new glorified body I will stand up on resurrected legs, and I will be next to the Lord Jesus.
