## I. The CAUSES of Defilement (vv.6-8)

- The Lord gives a laundry list of things going on for years among His people that caused the temple and land of Israel to become a spiritual wasteland
- Unfaithfulness Abandoning regular worship of the Lord
- Forsaking the Lord Turning face away from the Lord
- Turning back on the Lord Negligence
  - Defilement among God's people didn't take place overnight; it was a year after year turning away from the Lord that led them to the terrible situation Hezekiah now had to address.
