- Some have suggested James is targeting those outside the church....but he uses the 2nd person pronoun "you" addressing those inside the church who will be reading his letter
- James is addressing those who outwardly profess faith in Jesus Christ and claim allegiance to Him and yet in the way they get, spend, and misuse their money, they demonstrate otherwise.
- Problem: Rich people who were using their wealth for s purposes and then persecuting and taking advantage of the poor among them in the process.
